JABU set to empower 8000 clergies



About eight thousand Pastors of the Christ Apostolic Church, Worldwide are set to acquire administrative and managerial skills in the Enhanced Leadership Administrative Training (ELAT), workshop organised by the Premier Entrepreneurial University in Nigeria, Joseph Ayo Babalola University.

Speaking at the opening ceremony of the first of 16 batches of the programme, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Professor Sola Fajana stated that the main thrust of the training workshop was to empower clergymen to be compliant with the 21st century ecclesiastical order so as to ensure wide propagation of the gospel.

The President of Christ Apostolic Church, Worldwide, Pastor Abraham Akinosun described the empowerment leadership initiative as one set to effect radical change for upward development in the Church.

It is worthy to note that about 500 Chairmen of District Coordinating Councils and 1544 District Superintendents of Christ Apostolic Church, as well as the Osun State Chapter executives of the Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN), had taken part in the JABU Programme since inception in 2014.

The Enhanced Leadership Administrative Training would run at a stretch for eight months from October 2016.

3rd JABU Quiz Competition: Good Tidings Standard College, Produces Champ

Abegunrin Peter Abimbola of Good Tidings Standard College, Osogbo emerged the winner at the 3rd Annual National Quiz Competition for secondary schools, organised and sponsored by Joseph Ayo Babalola University.

Abegunrin achieved the feat after a long heated contest between him and the first runner-up, Onibonoje Tiwaloluwa Precious of Academia High School, Ilesha. Tiwaloluwa, a physically challenged teen, who was assisted to the platform by his father, did not cease to impress the audience from the beginning of the competition to the final round.

Sadly, he was knocked out at the last stage when he spelt the word 'Abnegate' incorrectly and the expectant crowd who hoped he would emerge the winner could not conceal their depression.

Prior to the final stage of the competition, all the 28 contestants were tested in Computer-Based Test, Aptitude Test, English Language, Mathematics and General Knowledge, in the competition that lasted for two days.

The winner carted away weighty prizes, such as N200,000 worth of books, N50,000 cash prize, a desktop computer and the most significant of all, a full scholarship to study any course of his choice in JABU for a period of 4 or 5 years, depending on the period of the programme chosen. While Onibonoje Tiwaloluwa Precious, the second and third place winner, Adebisi Emmanuel Adebayo of Bibo Oluwa Academy, Ilesha, were also given full scholarships respectively with cash prizes and books worth several thousands of naira.

The last ten contestants were given consolation prizes while all the contestants were awarded certificates of participation and encouraging prizes.

In his briefing, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Sola Fajana stated that JABU has continuously realised the importance of children and education in the society and it spares nothing at ensuring that the two vital subjects are given maximum attention. He added that the University has not ceased in its journey towards intellectual excellence and will continue to strive for further improvement in the field of advanced education and research.
