

JABU Vice-Chancellor Discloses Zero Tolerance for Truancy and Exam Malpractice

In a bid to instill discipline and improve academic performance, the Vice-Chancellor of Joseph Ayo Babalola University (JABU), Professor Olasebikan Fakolujo, has stressed the need for regular class attendance and truancy avoidance among students.

During an interactive session organised by the Student Union Executives through the Student Affairs Unit, Fakolujo urged students to prioritise their academic responsibilities and attend classes regularly, warning that the university would not tolerate truancy.

While addressing the students' concerns on various issues, Fakolujo also emphasised the importance of upholding Christian values, such as attending Bible study and chapel activities, which are compulsory for all students. He warned that defaulters would be sanctioned accordingly.

He assured students that the University Management is working towards improving the learning environment, security, power supply, and internet facilities, as well as providing more comfortable and convenient hostels. However, he stressed that the students' responsibilities cannot be overemphasised, especially in meeting the 70% class attendance requirement.

Fakolujo challenged the students to shun exam malpractice and tardiness to classes and events. He also urged them to focus on building positive interpersonal relationships, even in unfavourable circumstances and reiterated his vision of making JABU a 21st-century university by the end of his tenure, calling on students to work together towards this goal.
