

JABU Vice-Chancellor Emphasises the Importance of Training for Academic Staff Performance

for the summit have been carefully selected to meet the prevailing and dynamic aspects of modern teaching and research. Research work should be tested and applied, and assessments must be firm to maintain discipline.”

The academic summit, themed "Developmental Issues on Internal Academics in JABU," covered sub-themes such as Imbibing academic culture for optimal performance, The role of the department in enhancing the smooth running of the university, and Enhancing town-gown partnerships for the development of sustainable development goals.
